REQUIREMENTS & PREREQUISITS:

1. All applicants for the M1 Garand Clinic must be 14 years of age or older.
2. Applicants for the Junior M1 Carbine Clinic must be between 10 and 18 years of age.
3. All applicants must complete and have the enclosed liability release form notarized and return the form with the application. (Parent or legal guardian must sign for minor shooters.)
4. All applicants must have prior firearms training or experience.

2. Complete the Liability Release Form and have it notarized.
3. Send both forms along with a check for the appropriate amount to the address indicated on the Clinic Application form.

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M1 GARAND & JUNIOR M1 CARBINE CLINIC

The M1 Garand and Junior M1 Carbine Clinic is intended for shooters 10 years of age and older who do have prior shooting experience or training. The Garand Clinic is reserved for those ages 14 and up. The Clinic assumes attendees already know and practice safe firearm handling procedures and know basic marksmanship fundamentals. These subjects are reviewed as part of the clinic, but it not the goal or intent of this clinic to teach the basic concepts of these particular subjects.

The Clinic is intended to introduce shooters to competitive marksmanship by conducting a "practice" rifle match. All aspects of this rifle match are presented in a classroom environment so the attendees know what to expect once they get out to the firing range. The standing, kneeling, sitting and prone firing positions used for competitive shooting are presented and practiced in the classroom prior to actual firing. There are several coaches/assistants present on the firing range to answer questions, help shooters adjust sights, spot where shots are hitting, etc. The clinic is structured, but conducted in a casual or easy-going manner, and at the same time, conducted SAFELY. NRA Certified Rifle Safety Instructors conduct the clinic and assist in coaching on the firing range. The object is to conduct a safe rifle match, but to not make it stressful or intimidating for any of the junior or adult shooters as this is intended to be an introduction to competitive shooting.

The Meade Rod & Gun Club has some rifles available for loan and will provide all ammunition and safety equipment for this clinic. Any shooters may indeed bring their own items if they prefer and are encouraged to do so.

Upon completion of the clinic, each shooter will receive a certificate confirming that they have attended the clinic. This certificate will fulfill the firing requirement of the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Rifle Purchase Program. Information on the various rifles available for purchase from the CMP, as well as rifle purchase application packets, will be available at the clinic.

This clinic will provide the attendees with basic rifle safety instruction, general marksmanship instruction and specific instruction in shooting in competitive High Power Rifle matches. Proper operation, care and cleaning of the M1 Garand and M1 Carbine rifles will be covered in detail. Each attendee will fire 10 rounds for familiarization and sighting in and 30 rounds in a “Qualifying” course of fire which fulfills the firing requirements of the Civilian Marksmanship Program. Each attendee will receive a certificate indicating completion of the prescribed course of fire. NRA Certified Rifle Instructors conduct the Clinic.

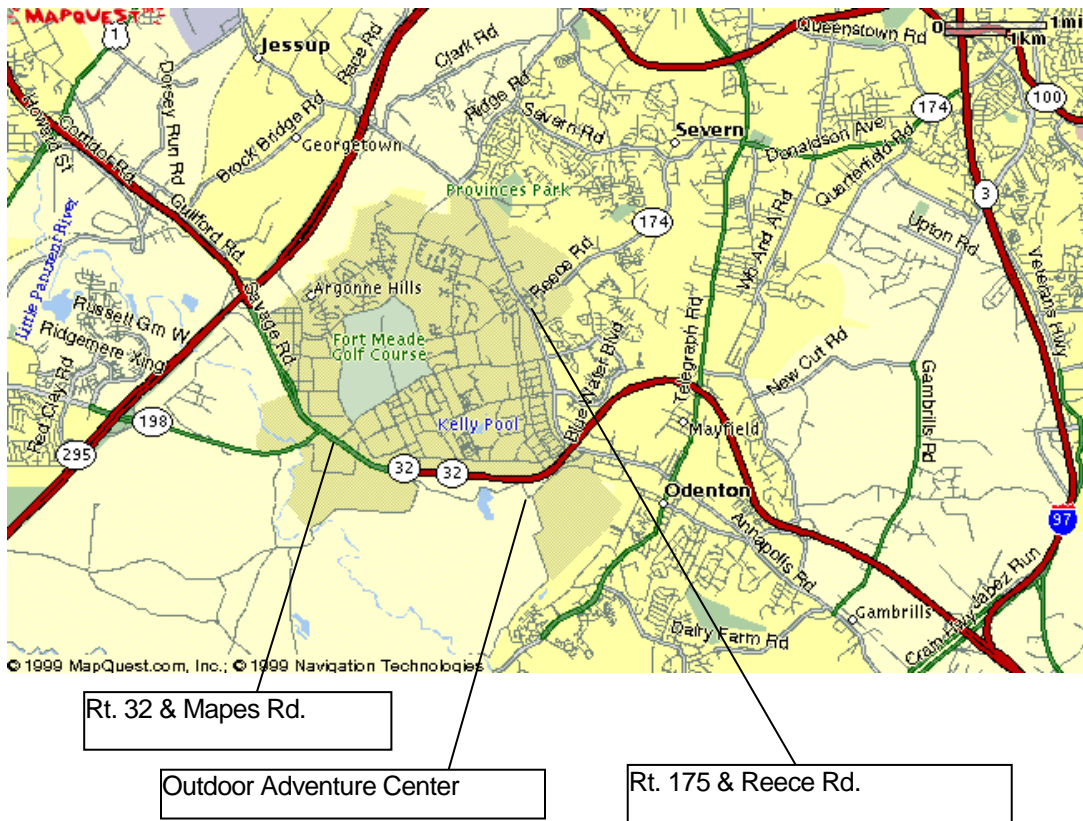

Directions to Outdoor Adventure Center:

From the North:

From HWY 295S, take Rt. 175 East. Turn right into the main entrance for Ft. Meade, Reece Road. Take the first immediate left at Ernie Pyle St. You will go through three stop signs. Ernie Pyle turns into Pepper Rd and crosses a large bridge over Rt. 32. (4 lane divided Hwy.) The road then comes to a T. Turn right. The Outdoor Adventure Center is on the right, Building T4, a large brown building next to the Pet Care Facility.

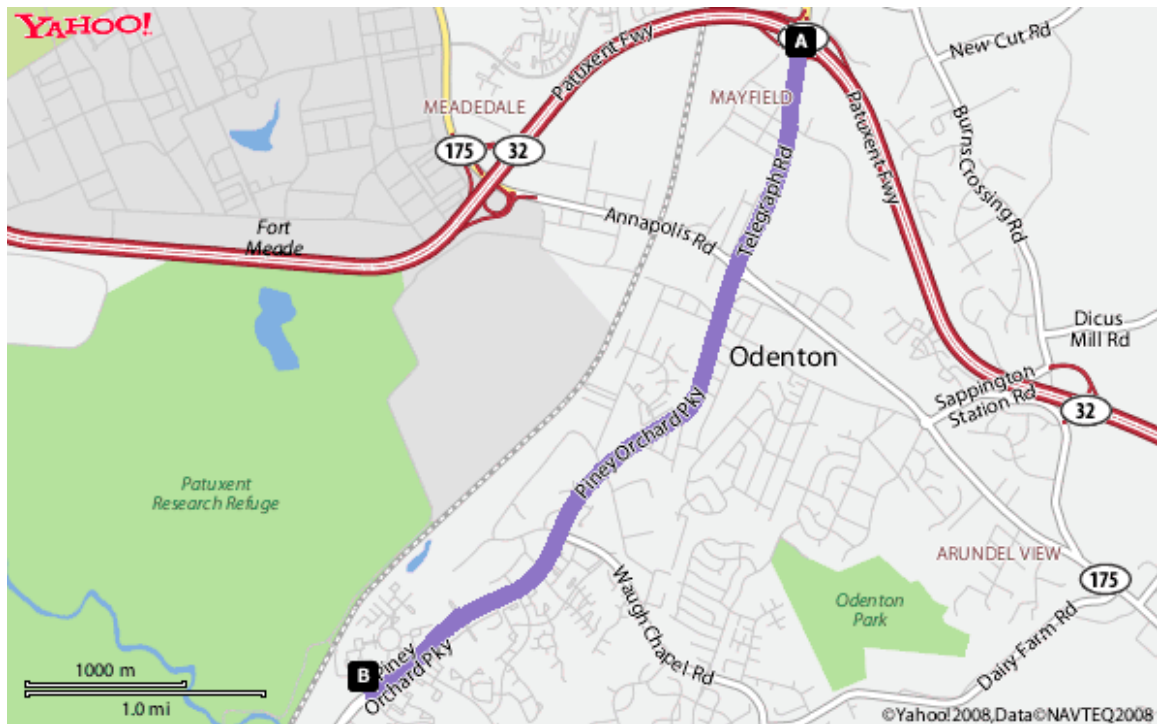


From the South:

From the South, take HWY. 295 N to Rt. 198 east to Rt. 32 east. Take the Left into Ft. Meade on Mapes Rd. and immediately take the first right on to O'Brien Rd. This becomes Dutt Rd. as it turns to the left. Turn Right at Zimborski Ave. This will become Rock Ave. At the fork, stay right on Rock Ave. and turn Right at Pepper Rd over the bridge crossing Rt. 32. Turn right at the "T". The Outdoor Adventure Center is on the right, Building T4, a large brown building next to the Pet Care Facility.

Directions to Ft. Meade Ranges

From Rt. 100 or Rt. 175, take Rt. 170 (Telegraph Rd.) South. Go past the intersection of Rt. 32 and Rt. 175. Rt. 170 (Telegraph Rd.) changes into Piney Orchard Parkway. Go Approximately 3 miles past the Rt. 175 intersection and turn right on Riverscape Rd. Take the first left onto Range Rd. The gate to the ranges is about ½ mile down Range Rd. For a map search, search for Riverscape Rd. and Range Rd, Odenton, MD.





AFFIDAVIT AND LIABILITY AGREEMENT



To assist in explaining the affidavit requirement for participation in Civilian Marksmanship Program events, the following information is provided.

Congress in Public Law 104-106 enacted in February 1996 imposed the affidavit requirement. This legislation allowed the Civilian Marksmanship Program to continue by transferring it from the Army to a new private entity created by Congress called the Corporation for Promotion of Rifle Practice and Firearms Safety, Inc.

Section 40723 title 36 United States Code provides:

- (1) Before a person may participate in any activity sponsored or supported by the Corporation, the person shall be required to certify by affidavit the following:
 - A) The person has not been convicted of any Federal or State felony or violation of section 922 of title 18.
 - B) The person is not a member of any organization that advocates the violent overthrow of the United States Government.

By definition an affidavit is a statement that is sworn before an official authorized to administer an oath, for example, a notary public. That in brief, is the reason for this procedure. Unless and until the law is changed, we have to comply with it.

There are some steps you can take to minimize the inconvenience. First, each person needs to make the affidavit only ONCE (not at every event). The affidavit need not be completed at the event, but can be done well in advance. For example, the club could distribute the affidavit form to all its members with its next regular mailing, thus cover all of its own members. Event announcements could include a notice that any non-members desiring to participate bring with them a completed affidavit. This affidavit is required only for participants' 18 years of age and older.

Further, there is no requirement to send these affidavits to the CMP. They are to be retained by the club. The club officers simply certify in their annual reports to the CMP that the club requires such affidavits for all participants, and that they are kept on file. The only affidavits that the CMP itself will keep are those we require annually, at the National Trophy Matches.

It should be pointed out that the affidavit has at least one redeeming feature. You will note that the form provided by the CMP has two parts. The first part is the certification required by law, discussed above; the second part is a waiver of liability. This protects the club sponsoring the event as well as the CMP against any claim caused by the carelessness of others. Lawsuits against anyone with the remotest connection to a mishap are an unfortunate fact these days. This can be financially ruinous to many clubs that do not have the resources to fight frivolous claims. The fact that the waiver of liability is included within a document that is notarized reinforces its validity.



ELIGIBILITY AFFIDAVIT AND LIABILITY AGREEMENT

- A. To establish my eligibility under section 40723 Title 36 United States Code to participate in any activity sponsored or supported by the Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP), I hereby certify that:
1. I have not been convicted of any Federal or State felony or violation of Section 922 of title 18 United States Code, and
 2. I am not a member of any organization that advocates the violent overthrow of the United States Government.
- B. In consideration for being permitted to participate in any activity sponsored or supported by the Civilian Marksmanship Program, I hereby agree to:
1. Be bound by the Civilian Marksmanship Program Competition Rules,
 2. Waive any claim against the Corporation for the Promotion of Rifle Practice and Firearms Safety and any other organization sponsoring or supporting the activity for any personal injury, loss or damage that I might suffer in connection with the activity, and
 3. Defend, indemnify and hold harmless any organization sponsoring or supporting the activity from any claim of a third party arising from any negligent or wrongful conduct by me.
